CRPF: This Sunday-Rally to Save Landmark Cliffs and Heritage Site from Residential Project

MONTREAL, QUEBEC--(CCNMatthews - May 5, 2006) -

As reported by CBC, CTV, TVA, The Gazette, several radio stations and local papers, the magnificent cliffs seen from highway 15 near Prevost and Piedmont might be threatened by residential development.

CRPF (www.parcdesfalaises.ca), a local non profit group, is asking the government to protect this last wilderness refuge. This area, formerly known as Shawbridge Boys's Farm, is the most visible heritage of the English speaking community in the Laurentians.

A rally will be held on May 7 at 2 PM at Prevost Old Train Station. Elected officials, artists, spoke persons for support groups will voice their concerns for the future of this ecological wonder and Herman Smith 'Jackrabbit' Johannsen's 100 years old network of trails. Mrs Karin Austin, Herman Johannsen grand-daughter, Anouk Leblanc-Boucher, double olympic medalist, will be among the guests.
